

STEVE SALUTAN


















"We got a cover out at the garden. It looks nice out there."

"Steve doesn't know I took this picture! Matt is brushing Duke. I like Duke. he is a 900d cow."




"We went on a hike."

BBQ Pork Chop Salad

BBQ Pork Chops

Ingredients:

- 1/2 Cup BBQ Sauce
- 3 Tbs. Honey Mustard
- 2 Tsp. Rosemary
- · 4 Boneless Pork Loin Chops about 1 inch thick
- 1/4 Tsp. Salt
- 1/4 Tsp. Pepper

Directions:

Heat up grill. In a small bowl, mix BBQ sauce, honey mustard, and rosemary until well blended. Set aside. Sprinkle both sides of pork chop with salt and pepper. Place pork chops on grill over medium heat. Cook 15 to 20 minutes, turning once or twice, until meat thermometer inserted in center reads 145 degrees, brushing with BBQ sauce mixture during last 5 minutes of cook time.

Green Salad

Ingredients:

- Red Leaf Lettuce, chopped
- Green Leaf Lettuce, chopped
- · Red Onion, sliced
- · Cucumber, sliced
- Red Bell Pepper, sliced
- · Tomato, sliced
- · Broccoli, chopped
- Avocado, sliced
- · Hard Boiled Eggs, peeled and sliced
- Shredded Cheese

Combine all ingredients and top with BBQ pork chops and your favorite dressing.

The Inside Scoop with Kevin Donaghey

Interview with: Andy McFarland from Farm Supply



Can you please share with our readers the history of Farm Supply and its involvement in our community?

You betcha! Farm Supply has been taking care of local farmers since 1950. We have changed a lot of the things over the years to meet the changing needs of farmers. A great example of that, farmers used to flood irrigate, now they do drip and micro irrigation to conserve water. This is so critical now with a lack of water here on the Central Coast. You may not know this, but Farm Supply is a co-op made up of ranchers and farmers. We don't have an owner per se. In other words; co-op members, farmers, and ranchers from Ventura to King City are our owners. We have over 2,500 members. The Farm Supply board of directors is made up of farmers and ranchers from each of our 5 locations. Board members make decisions about our company with recommendations from our corporate office. Our new CEO Kara Crye, just took over from former CEO James Braebeck. James was CEO for Farm Supply for 50 years. Kara went to Cal Poly and interned with James for many years. Kara comes from a family owned construction company in San Luis Obispo County. It is important for the CEO to network with big farming organizations, municipalities, and non-profit organizations. Kara along with Farm Supply are very involved in the community. She is a wonderful lady, we all love her!

Does Farm Supply sell Animals?

We sell mostly game birds like chickens, turkeys, guinea hens, quail, pheasants, ducks.





What types of items can be purchased at Farm Supply?

Farm Supply sells farm animal feed, pet food and supplies, and tack gear. We sell agricultural fertilizers, supplies, and chemicals. We also have ranching supplies that including: fencing and watering systems, irrigation supplies, and safety supplies for any or all farm/ranch operations. We have clothing for work, ranch, and farm. We try to stay diversified in our products so we are always selling something. For example, in the rainy season, we are going to sell rain gear; and so on.





How many Farm Supply locations are there and where are they located?

We have five locations that are in Buellton, Santa Maria, Arroyo Grande, San Luis Obispo, and Paso Robles.







What types of animals do you carry feed for?

We carry feed for just about all birds. We have fish food for ponds and lakes. Catfish and trout food, are a good example of fish food we carry. Of course we have feed for horses, cows, pigs, llamas, goats, sheep, and any of your large farm animals. Farm Supply carries food for some exotic animals as well, like tortoises. We carry all of the hays: straw, alfalfa, forage mix (wheat, barley, and oat), timothy hay, and orchard hay.





If I am a first time animal owner, can Farm Supply help me figure out what supplies I will need for my new animal?

Yes, of course we can! We will guide you with any of your food, husbandry, and grooming needs. Farm Supply also carries vaccines for most animals. We have experts that specialize in different areas of farming and ranching. For example: we have a horse expert, sheep expert, etc. Different employees specialize in different animals, irrigation practices, and so on.







I see that Farm Supply offers Community Veterinary Clinics. Can you please tell me more about that program?

Well that is an outside company that we allow to use our barn here on Saturdays, between 10:00am and 11:30am. They do small animal care. They are not a part of the Farm Supply company, but we allow them to work their program at Farm Supply as a service to our community.





Are rain reservoir type gauges available on the store shelves at Farm Supply?

Yes, we do carry rain gauges. We carry manual tube style and electronic. We also carry regular thermometers and minimum/maximum registry thermometers. These tools help farmers know what the lowest temperature is in the evenings and the highest temperature during the day. Farmers record their temperatures and act according to the needs of their crops.





What other types of goods and equipment does Farm Supply sell?

We sell tanks, hand tools, fence posts, wire, irrigation systems, clothing, safety equipment, pest deterrents, and we sell vegetable starter plants at this location. Some of our other stores have a full service nursery. Each of our stores is slightly different because each location has different clientele. The demographics are different from store to store.





I find weather vanes to be very interesting. What is the purpose of weather vanes? Do you carry weather vanes at Farm Supply?

A weather vane will tell you what direction the wind is blowing. We do carry weather vanes, windmills, and wind gauges.





I see that Farm Supply carries all of the items necessary to build an animal shelter or pen. Can you tell me what is the most peculiar animal that you have ever supplied a shelter for?

Well...I guess it would have to be something like a llama or an alpaca. We have provided shelters for tortoises too!




What are the hours and days of operation at Farm Supply?
